THE GRAND CANYON



The Grand Canyon is located in the US State of Arizona. It is a deep, narrow valley with steep sides.

SIZE

The Grand Canyon is 446km in length. Its width ranges from 6km to 29km and is 1.8km deep.

CLIMATE

Weather varies depending on elevation. Summers are warm but winters are freezing.

LIFE IN THE CANYON

The canyon is home to Native American tribes, as well as an abundance of wildlife, including bison, coyotes, squirrels, beavers, deer, eagles, toads and reptiles, to name a few.



FUN FACTS

- Contains some of the oldest exposed rocks on earth.
- Became a national park in 1919.
- The canyon is the site of many fossils - but none of them are dinosaur bones.

FORMATION

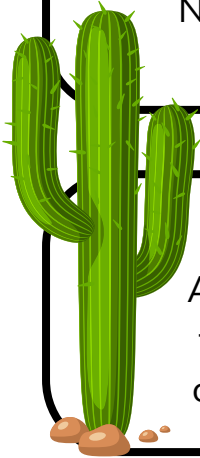
The canyon was formed millions of years ago when the Colorado River cut a channel through layers of rock. The river continues to erode the rock sides. It is estimated to be between 5 and 70 million years old.

The Grand Canyon State

Arizona is home to the Grand Canyon, one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World! It's so big that it could fit 19 Statues of Liberty stacked on top of each other.



Cactus Heaven

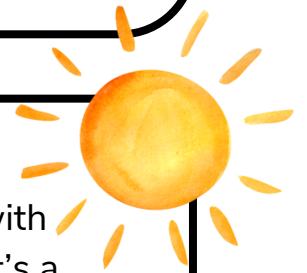
Arizona has giant cacti called saguaro (suh-WAHR-oh) that can grow as tall as a two-story house and live for over 150 years. They only grow in the Sonoran Desert!

Roadrunner Realities

The famous cartoon bird, the Road Runner, is based on a real bird that lives in Arizona. They're super fast and can run up to 20 miles per hour!

Sunshine Galore

Arizona is one of the sunniest places in the world, with some cities getting over 300 sunny days a year. That's a lot of time for outdoor fun!



Meteor Crater

Arizona has a giant hole in the ground called Meteor Crater, made by a space rock crashing into Earth about 50,000 years ago. It's like a real-life science experiment!

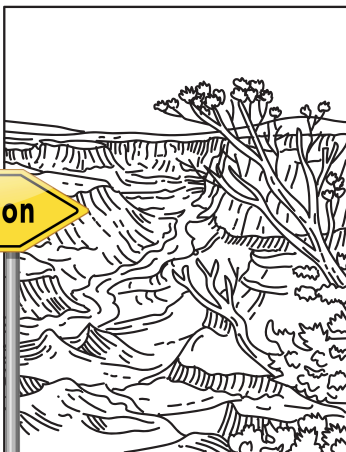

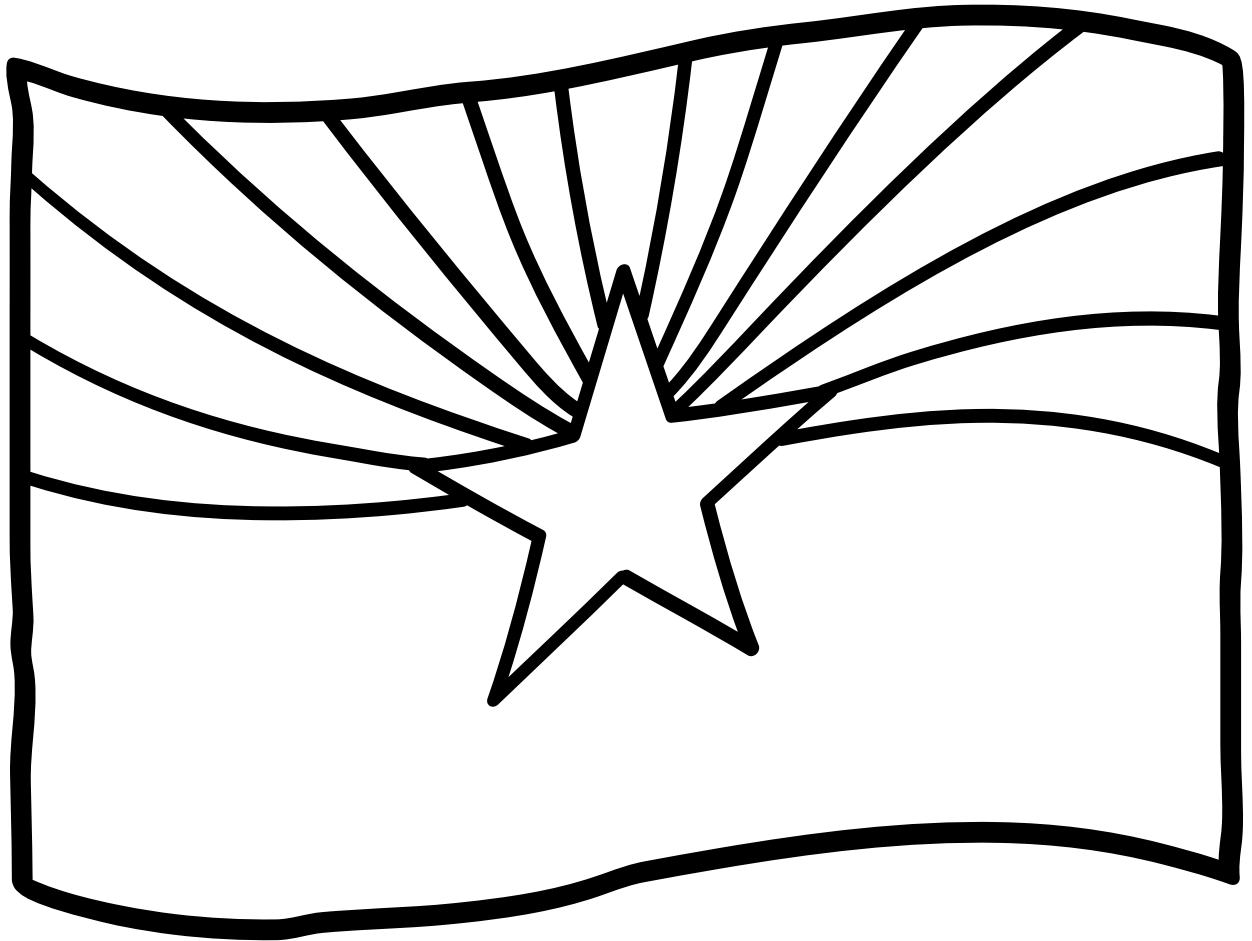

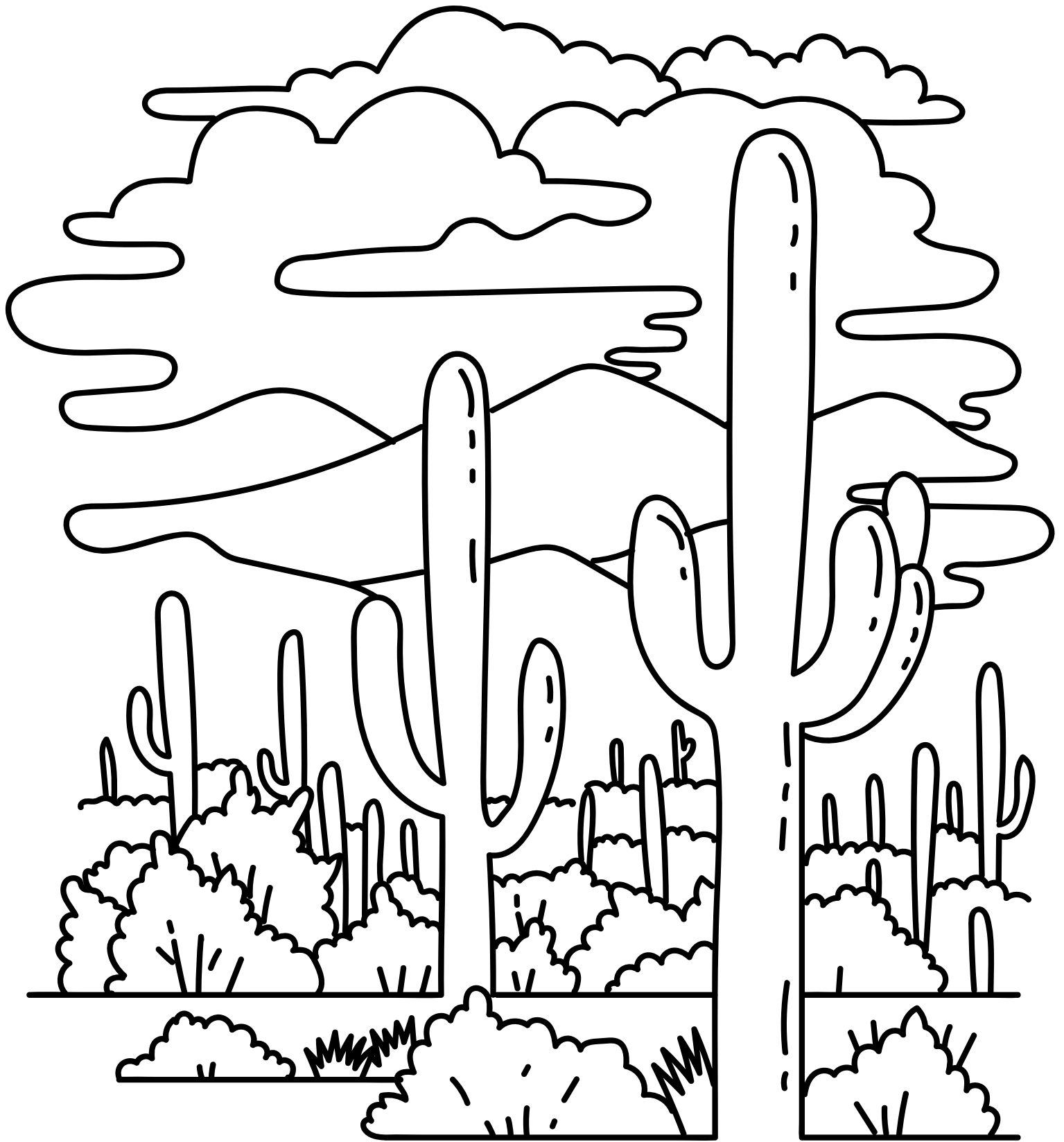

Rules:

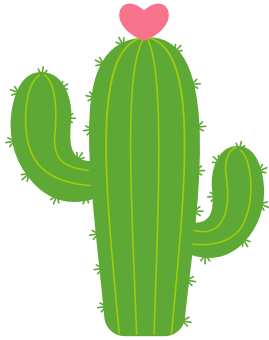
1. Set Up: Lay all the cards face down in rows so you can't see the pictures.

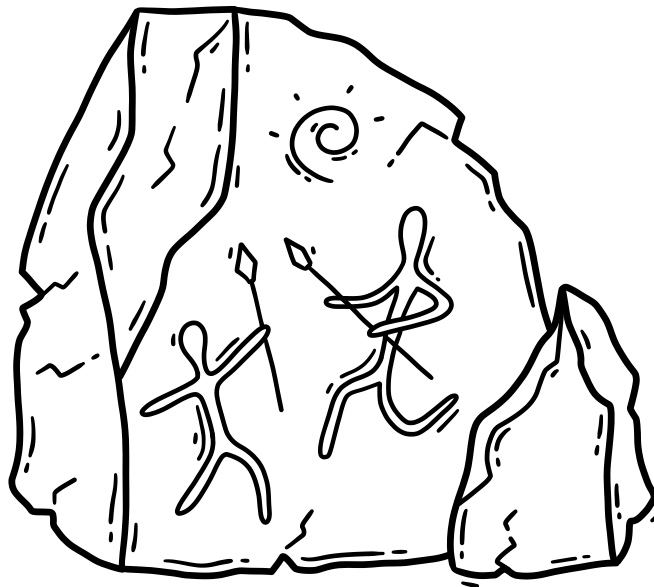




WHAT ARE PETROGLYPHS AND ROCK ART?

A long, long time ago, before there were books or computers, people told stories and shared ideas by drawing pictures on rocks! These pictures are called petroglyphs or rock art. They were made by Native Americans and other ancient people thousands of years ago. They used sharp tools or stones to carve shapes, animals, and symbols into the rocks. Sometimes, they even painted on the rocks using natural colors made from plants and minerals.

These drawings were like messages or stories. They might show animals they hunted, important events, or even things they believed in. It's like looking at a secret code from the past!



CREATE YOUR OWN ROCK ART!

Now it's your turn to be like the ancient artists! Think about what story or message you want to share. Maybe you want to draw your favorite animal, something you love to do, or a symbol that means something special to you. Use paper and crayons, markers, or pencils to create your own "rock art." Some of the animals that live in the Sonoran desert are the rattlesnake, the roadrunner, the gila woodpecker, the jackrabbit, the small kit fox.

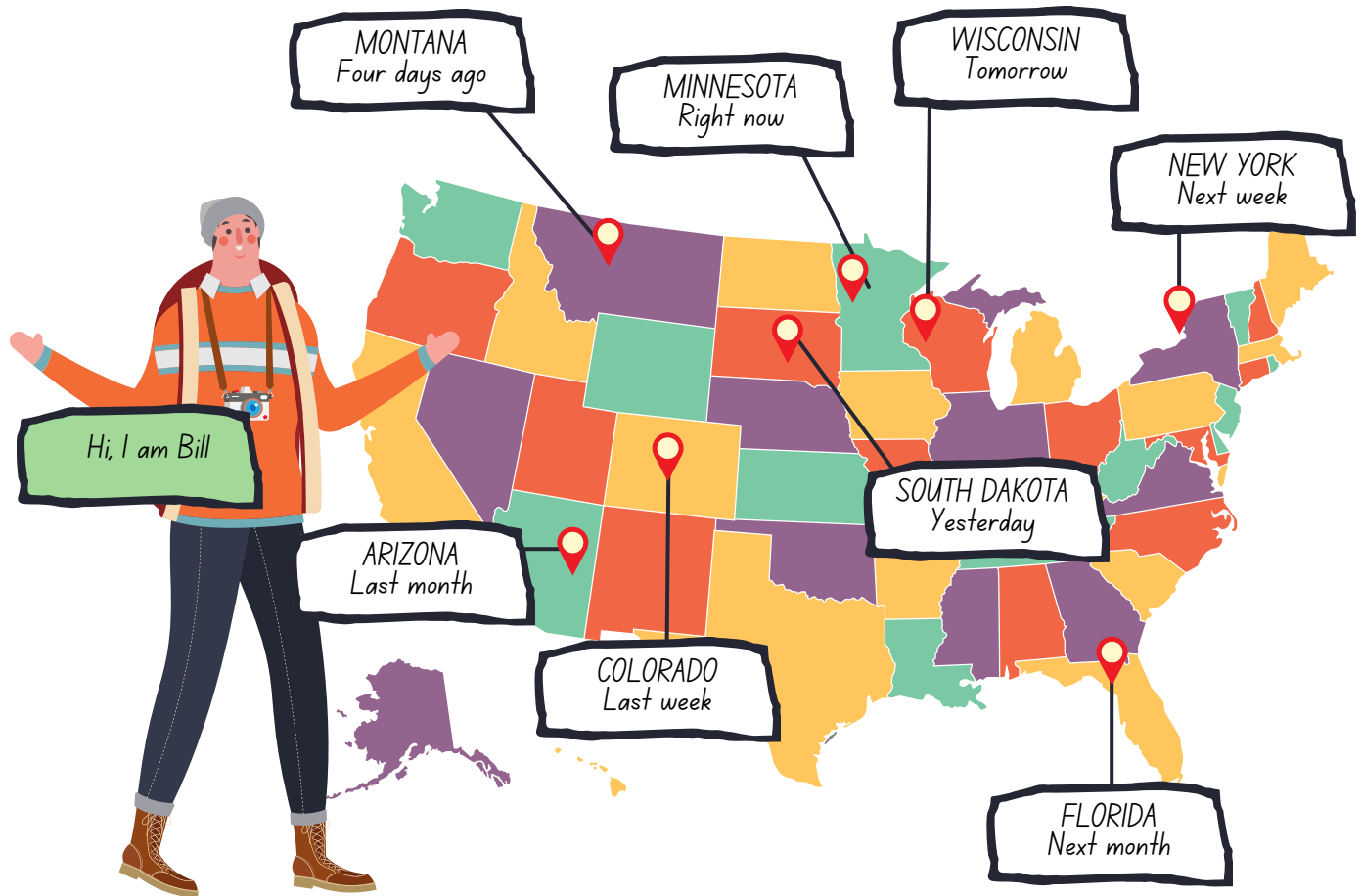

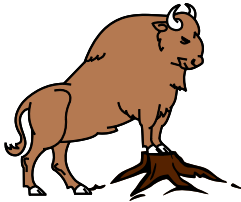
THE GRAND CANYON

The Grand Canyon is considered one of the 7 Wonders of the Natural World. It is located in the US State of Arizona.



The canyon is not the widest, longest nor deepest canyon in the world. However, it is the second most visited national park in the USA, and popular for hiking, rafting and sightseeing. It is 446km in length, and 29km at its widest point.

The Colorado River runs through the canyon. It is this river that for millions of years has caused rock erosion, forming the canyon. As such, it has become a great site for scientists to study fossil records along the exposed rock walls. The most common fossils found are those of ancient marine life.



The weather changes depending on the elevation. Summers are hot and winters are freezing. The canyon is home to Native American tribes, as well a numerous wildlife, including elk, bison, squirrels, eagles, coyotes, reptiles and amphibians.

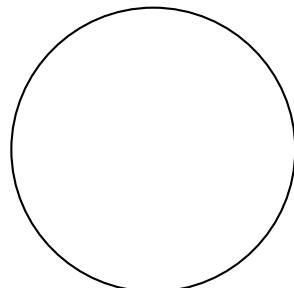
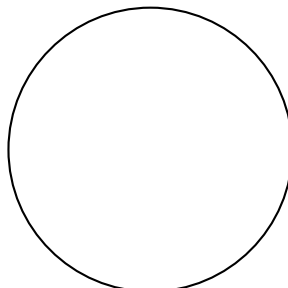
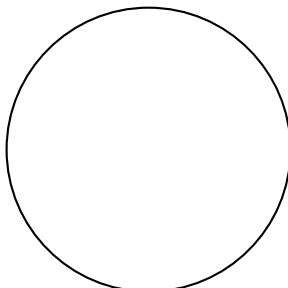
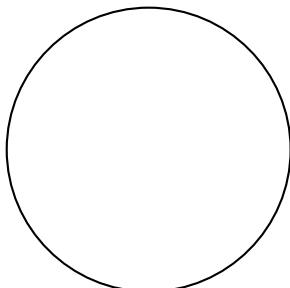
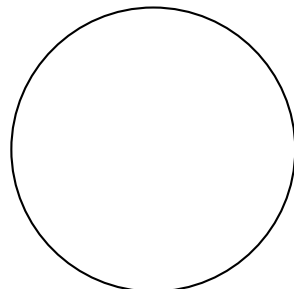
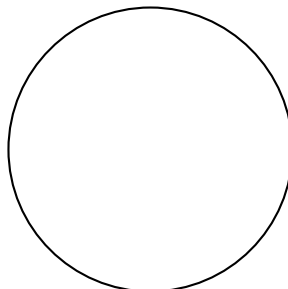
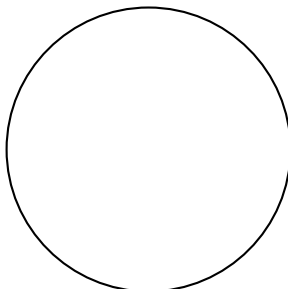
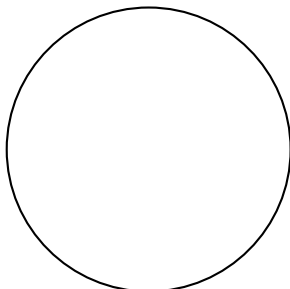
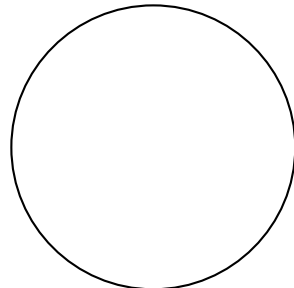
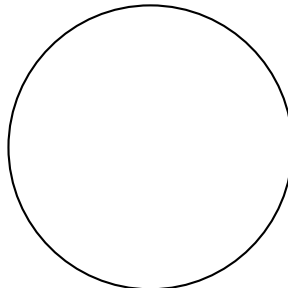
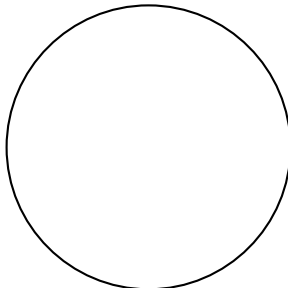
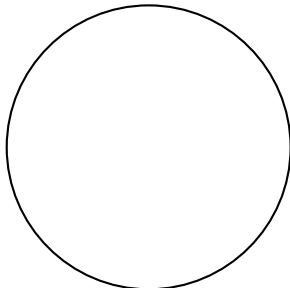
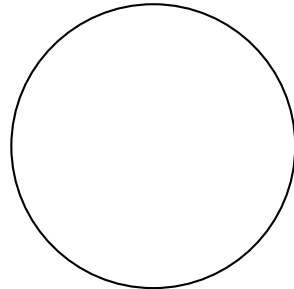
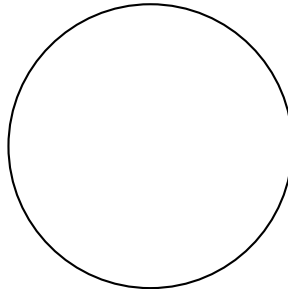
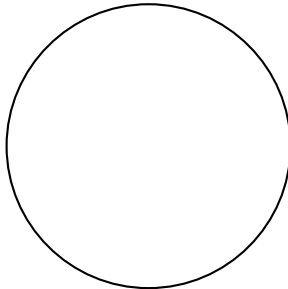
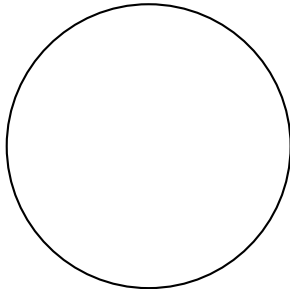
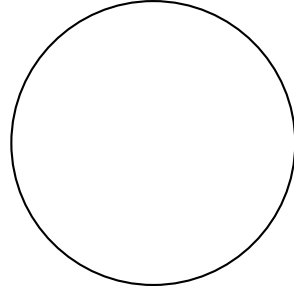
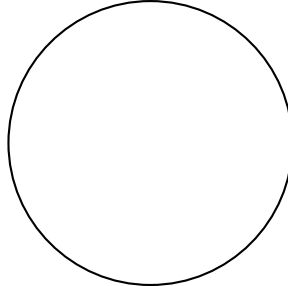
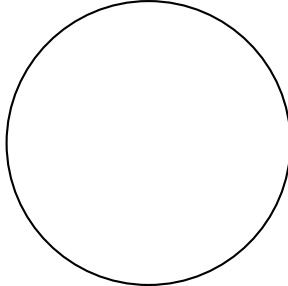
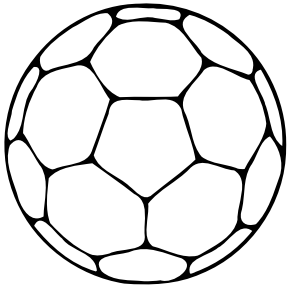
